SHOW REGULATIONS (Junior Exhibitors)

It is recommended that exhibitors read the following Regulations thoroughly.

AT ALL SHOWS:

1. Junior exhibitors must give the Show Secretary a minimum of three days' notice of all intended exhibits, or their exhibits may be refused.
2. Junior classes will be judged in two age groups: up to 8 year olds and 9 to 14 year olds at the date of the show. Young people over age 14 can enter in the adult classes.
3. Entry to Junior classes is free.
4. Staging times for exhibits at each show will be printed in the Society's newsletter published immediately preceding the relevant show. Non-members should contact the Show Secretary or visit the web site (www.nnhs.org.uk).
5. The Show Secretary provides a numbered card for each exhibit. The exhibitor must place each card face down under each exhibit and is responsible for the correct placing of these cards.
6. An exhibitor may not stage more than one entry per class.
7. Pot plants must have been in the possession of the junior exhibitor for the three months immediately before the show, unless raised by him/herself from seeds or cuttings in a shorter period.
8. The points value of prizes will be: 1st prize = 3 points, 2nd prize = 2 points, 3rd prize = 1 point.
9. Prize money will be paid from two hours prior to the close of the show. All prizes unclaimed by the end of the show will be forfeited to the Society.
10. Officials will be appointed by the Show Secretary to take control of the show venue, both while the show is open and while exhibits are being removed.
11. REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS. At closing time a bell will be rung. No exhibit shall be taken down or in any way interfered with until this has been done. All exhibits must be cleared within one hour of the scheduled close of the show.
12. Where an exhibit has to be "in a space of" the material used **MUST NOT** protrude.
13. The Society will not be responsible for any loss of or damage to exhibits whilst at the show.
14. "All Shows" awards will be presented at the Society's Annual General Meeting (AGM). All other awards will be made at the end of each show. Medals and certificates will be retained by the exhibitor. Trophies are presented, the exhibitor given a photo opportunity and then the trophy is retained by the society. A register of all awards is available for inspection at all shows and the AGM.

Amendments may be made to these schedules during the specified period. Up to date copies of each separate show schedule are available on the Society website. Exhibitors are advised to check the website prior to shows for notice of any amendments.

Classes J1 – J33: Open to all Juniors - FREE ENTRY.

There are two age groups at each show:

- **A – up to and including 8 years**
- **B – over 8 years up to and including 14 years**

TROPHIES: The NNHS medal will be awarded for the best exhibit in the Junior Section at each show. The following trophies will also be awarded for the best exhibit:

- Spring Show: A Challenge Cup, presented by Mrs A Pratt
- Summer Show: The BBC trophy
- Late Autumn Show: A Challenge Cup, presented by Mr Rowland Hill

All Shows: A Challenge cup, presented by Allwood Bros Ltd in 1947, will be awarded to the exhibitor who scores the greatest number of points in the Junior classes at all shows held by the Society during the year.

| B | J29 | Create a winter garden on a plate, maximum diameter 22cm. |
| B | J30 | Vase of three stems of shrubs, one or more distinct kinds. |
| B | J31 | Vase of three stems of chrysanthemums, one or more cultivars. |
| A | J32 | One foliage pot plant. |
| A | J33 | Write a poem about winter, own handwriting on A4 size paper. |
